### TSU's Wentworth Earns Excellence Award

Tri-State University Academic Support Service Director Kathie Wentworth has received the Indiana Association for Developmental Education (INADE) Outstanding Work in the Field of Developmental Education Award. Statewide award winners were recognized at an awards luncheon Nov. 2 in Indianapolis. The awards luncheon honored outstanding students and educators as a highlight of the INADE annual convention.

Those honored were nominated by a colleague or educator who witnessed the efforts of the award

recipient in completing or delivering developmental courses or supplemental activities.

Dr. David Finley, TSU Vice President for Academic Affairs, provided documentation to support Wentworth's selection.

As academic support services director, she developed the Academic Foundations program, which helps students to diagnose low skills sets and sharpen those areas.
